ENTERPRISE SUCCESS FOR NEWBATTLE

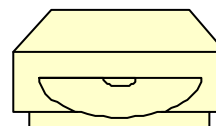


A team from Newbattle is celebrating after winning the Lothian section of the prestigious Royal Bank of Scotland Young Enterprise Awards.

Gary Ward, Skye O’Donnell, Grace Watson, Ian McAndrew and Gordon Robb produced a CD of more than 70 Scottish recipes which won the acclaim of the judges to beat off competition from 19 other schools.

The Final, held at Napier University, saw the team were grilled by representatives of RBS, the sponsors, about their business plan. They also had to produce a full report and make a presentation in front of an audience of 200 guests.

Primary 7 Transition Sports School

A 6-week school of sport for Primary 7 students took place at the end of last term at Newbattle High school with around 100 school pupils from all the areas Primary schools having a weekly free 2-hour session of activity over a period of six Wednesdays.

The sports initiative is using sport to try to make the transition from Primary 7 to High school easier for the pupils, as well as being a fun and exciting way to meet new friends from the other primary schools before the move in August

The pupils had a choice of swimming, basketball, hockey, athletics, short tennis, football, badminton and Dance with all groups coached by Newbattle High school PE staff and Karen Rooney a Dance Teacher and John Frame, the school Football coach. Each pupil could choose two activities during the sessions and in the final week all were brought together in the Games Hall for a multi sports event, based round the various activities which had been offer over the initiative. Each team took the identity of a Commonwealth Games Nation and the sides were mixed amongst the feeder primaries.

The weather smiled on the initiative causing no interruptions and the staff involved were impressed at both the enthusiasm and the skills shown by the participants.

Funding for the 6 week programme came from the Big Lottery Fund and the events were coordinated by Bob Foley, Head of PE at Newbattle, Marion McGill, Active schools coordinator and Ross Hamilton Project Officer Newbattle Integration team and all agree that the Sport school has been a tremendous success,

helping to support young people into activity and transition. At the end of each session students were given free fruit and juice which was again provided by the Big Lottery Fund. Equally important in this social time was the chance to talk and get to know pupils from all the other Primaries as well as some of the staff from the High school.

Mr Taylor Head Teacher at Newbattle welcomed all the students to the Sports school, and urged them to continue and develop their sport and fitness when they come to the High school in August.

Newbattle – Our School of Ambition

Firstly, by way of an introduction I would like to say hello to you as Depute Headteacher of our school with a part to play in the prestigious Schools of Ambition initiative. This is a Scottish Executive funded programme for which only 21 schools in Scotland have been selected.



The main reason Newbattle was selected for the programme was that ministers and inspectors recognised how well the school is already doing to promote leadership and success across the school. We aim, over the next three years, to build on that and make our school community even stronger.

The work on this initiative accelerated in January when over thirty teachers from the school gave up their weekend to take part in a leadership development programme. From this we have identified four main strands: sharing of good teaching practice across the school; a 'Peak Performance' section of the timetable for whole year groups to enhance their participation and expertise across the arts, sports and practical subjects; enhancing parental participation in the school; and perhaps most importantly, celebrating the success of our pupils. I hope to be able to share our progress in these areas with you on a regular basis.

To close, I would like to thank all the staff, pupils and parents who have welcomed me to the school since January. It's a great place to be.

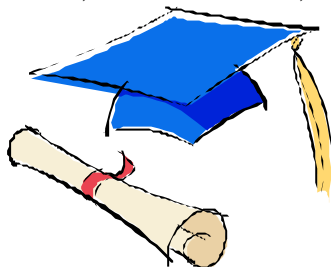

CSI: Newbattle



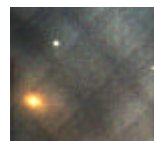

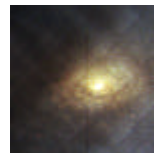

Faulkes Telescope Project

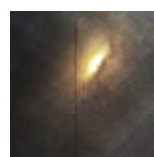

37000 thousand light years from earth.



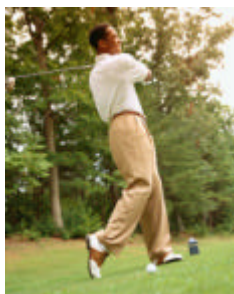
M106 galaxy

Newbattle scored a remarkable football first last month when the school supplied all the officials for the Scottish Schools Under 13 Cup Final between Banff Academy and Holyrood Secondary (Glasgow) at Alloa Athletic's Recreation Park.

We have been encouraging a number of footballers to attend SFA referee's courses and 4 pupils have qualified in the last two years - Andrew Jack, Liam Hall and Graeme Young all members of last year's League winning Under 16 squad and Kevin Meyers a member of this year's title winning squad.

In the middle of the match was Guidance Teacher Graham Dick who was assisted by Andrew Jack and Liam Hall. The match was uneventful and the team were roundly praised for their efforts receiving a medal as a memento of the prestigious occasion.

All of the group have all officiated at School Cup Finals and who knows one day we may see them in action in the SPL!



SUCCESSFUL SEASON FOR NEWBATTLE FOOTBALLERS

Newbattle Under 16 won the Lothian Schools league Trophy in dramatic fashion with a nail-biting 2-1 victory over Musselburgh Grammar after both sides had finished the season with an identical record. Newbattle had not been considered amongst the favourites at the start of the season but the team started with some spectacular results with the highlights being a 6-0 win over the much heralded James Young HS and an amazing 11-3 success over Craigmount who had a 100% record after 6 games.

The side had a good blend including three of the side which took the title last season and five Under 15's only lost one League game all season. As the season approached its conclusion we had several tough matches but the character of the side shone through time and time again coming back from two goals down to draw with Musselburgh and securing a last minute goal to defeat Ross High. Some stern tests

lay ahead as the season reached its conclusion with the crucial fixture seeing Lasswade defeated 3-1, a result which effectively ended the Lasswade title chances one of six consecutive wins which ensured that we could not be overtaken in the table. However the title was not secured as Musselburgh won their three games in hand to force a play-off..



The match, played at the excellent Newcraighall facility saw our side produce their best football of the season in the opening period inspired by the running of Mark Moncrieff, who had won the "Goal of the season award" with a strike earlier in the season against Gillespie's, and we were well worth the two goal lead secured with two goals from Darren Flynn, who broke the school scoring record with 35 goals this season. Musselburgh pulled a goal back on half-time and tried everything in the second period but could not find a way past the Newbattle defence in which goalkeeper Ryan Law excelled.

The win meant Newbattle retained the Shield won last season a feat only achieved once before in the 40 years of the Lothian wide competition.

For a while it looked like the **Under 14** side would emulate the success of the 16s but they were overpowered in their final game against a much physically stronger Lasswade side and had to settle for the runners-up position .

However there was more silverware to come as the **Under 15** side picked up the final trophy of the season winning the East & Midlothian Cup at Pinkie defeating Ross High, Musselburgh and St David's for the loss of only one goal before securing the Shield by defeating Lasswade 1-0 in a tense final thanks to an outstanding individual goal from James Watson. The winning side was : **Liam O'Meara , Keith Jack, Greg Haining, Martin Brown, Steven Quinn, Fraser Duncan, Gordon Ramsay, Daniel Louden, Andrew Jones, Owen Lean, James Guy and Calvin Wilson**. This was the first time East & Midlothian Schools have run an Under 15 Cup since 1998 when Newbattle were again the winners.



Four Newbattle players **James Guy, Darren Landells, Owen Lean and James Watson** represented East & Midlothian in the National Trophy. For the fourth time in five years the County side reached the Scottish Final, winning their group which contained Fife, Lanarkshire, and Ayrshire , then overcame Angus and Aberdeen in the Quarter and Semi Finals respectively but unfortunately lost to Fife in the Final.. Newbattle have now supplied 15 players to these sides in the four final years - the biggest representation of any school .



Graeme Young represented Lothian Under 18's in their three National Trophy matches this season.

For the second year in a row we will be taking part the Dana Cup in July in Hjorring in Northern Denmark .. This is the second biggest youth tournament in Europe with around 900 teams from 47 countries taking part. The facilities are magnificent and the competition fierce. Last we were one of only two Scottish sides taking part in the various age groups and won 5 out of seven matches in a tournament won by the Mexican National Youth side - such is the quality of opposition.
