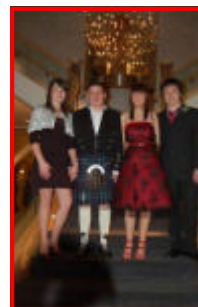

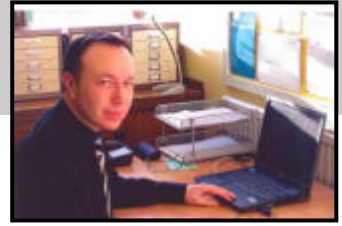
This event simply reinforces the Newbattle belief that every youngster has something worthwhile to contribute, given the opportunity.

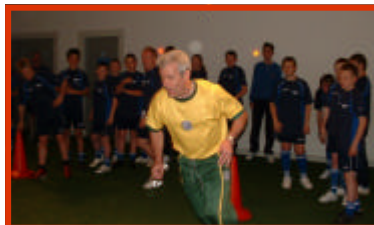

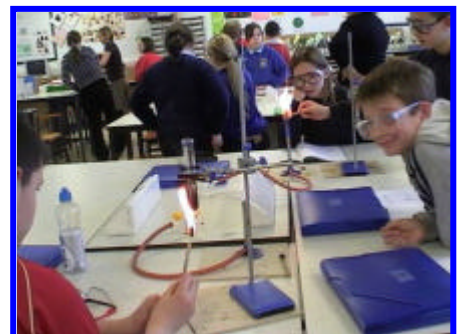
Ex England manager Kevin Keegan shows Newbattle pupils his skills. (top left)

Fast Track To Success

April signified the conclusion of the first year of the 'Fast Track to Success' programme. The successful completion of the programme was celebrated with a graduation ceremony. It was particularly pleasing to see so many Primary 7 pupils supported by their family members and teachers. The programme of teaching and learning started in October and lasted

for 18 weeks with each participating pupil receiving lessons in English, Mathematics and Science. The lessons were completed with pace and rigour and were reportedly fun and exciting. The pupils will now have the opportunity to build on these successes in the years to come at secondary school.



Media Studies and Opt in for Art: ZomRomCom

During March and April the Media Studies Int 1 group worked very successfully with Edinburgh's Fruitmarket Gallery to produce two short films as part of the Opt In For Art Initiative.

Students worked in two groups, one on a short zombie opening credit sequence and the other on a very different 'Romcom'.

Both film sequences were designed, filmed, acted and edited by pupils with a professional animator coming into school each

week to advise the students. The zombie movie was produced by Fraser McKay, Thomas Shearer, Thomas Grieve, Chelsea Smith and Amanda Smith while the Romcom was created by Siobhan Wallace, Michael Blaine, John Davidson and Keith Black. Students were extremely pleased with the results of the project as this also constituted a vital element of the Int 1 Media Studies course. The results looked very professional and took pride of place at a public exhibition at the Fruitmarket

Gallery in Edinburgh during April/May.

It is hoped next year's Media Studies group will also have the opportunity to become involved in a similar initiative in 2008.

Football Report 2007

A successful season at Newbattle with around 80 boys taking part in regular competition across four age groups.

Pride of place this season goes to the Under 13 side who took a while to settle but after Christmas produced a series of excellent performances and were the winners of the Charlie Wood Memorial Trophy (the EMSFA Under 13 Cup) beating Lasswade 2-0 in the final match thanks to two goals from top goalscorer Ryan Somerville. The side enjoyed a great run in the Scottish Under 13 Plate competition winning at Denny, Mintlaw and Peterhead before losing to St Mungo's 3-2 in a superb semi-final.

The Under 15 side had been bridesmaids in each of the two previous seasons but finally got their hands on some silverware

deservedly winning the EMSFA Under 15 Cup at Musselburgh. This side now go forward to the Dana Cup in Denmark in July.

Our Under 16s qualified for the Lothian Championship League and finished fourth. They made history by taking part in the first schools match played at the new multi-million pound Meggetland complex losing out to Portobello 2-1 in a spectacular Lothian Final.

The annual awards ceremony saw the following chosen as Player of the Season for their respective sides : Under 13 - Callum Gilzean; Under 14 - Conar Ramsay; Under 15 - Ewan Wilson; Under 16 Sean Gillies. The top goal scorer was James Guy with 23 goals.
